Footprints Across Poulsbo — A new event for Poulsbo and Kitsap County

If you enjoyed our Ghosts in the Graveyard event last fall, we will be taking a similar show on the road on June 18! From 10 AM to noon that Saturday, you are invited to take part in Footprints Across Poulsbo, an interactive Story Walk that get you moving through the city's past, present and future. This is one of 11 walks presented this fall by Josh Farley of the Kitsap Sun and their partner, Kitsap Moves.

Gather your family (all ages welcome!) and pick up a map at the Pavilion in Waterfront Park. Then trek around Poulsbo as you learn some history, as shared by a local actor or history enthusiast. You can reward yourself with a sticker at each stop while getting your day's exercise at your own pace. The two-mile walk will feature both residential and commercial parts of Poulsbo. Walkers, who fill each sticker spot and make it to the end at our Heritage Museum, will receive a small, but attractive prize.

This event brings together a number of local organizations providing assistance for the route, which was researched and designed by Judy Driscoll of Poulsbo Historical Society. Participating are City of Poulsbo, Parks and Recreation, Jewel Box Theatre, Rotary of Poulsbo/North Kitsap, and Coffee Oasis, as well as other volunteers from Poulsbo Historical Society.

In connection with the event, we are still looking for volunteers to sit at each stop with the re-enactor and hand out map stickers to those trekking the route. A few stops will also have water bottles to hand out to the walkers. Plan on being available from 9:30 AM to 12:30 PM that day. To volunteer, let MaryAnn know if you would like to sit at

Memorial installed at the Maritime

Thanks to David Shields, right, for spear-heading the drive to install a Fishermen's Memorial at the Maritime Museum to honor the fishermen and vessels that made Poulsbo their home port. David acquired the propeller, which came from the "Olympic," a haibut schooner built in 1911. Local businesses, Watsilla Defense Systems and Valykrie Enterprises donated their time to polish and prepared the propeller for display. PHS volunteers coordinated the installation.

MUSEUM UPDATES



How much weight do you pull?

We are fortunate that there are many creative volunteers at PHS. Recently, Maritime volunteer Chris Morrison asked if he could recreate a pulley exhibit he had seen in San Francisco at Fisherman's Wharf. Not ones to turn down an offer like that, we cheered as Chris went about his project. The exhibit is now complete in the boatyard, and visitors can pull the ropes, to experience the difference various pulley configurations make when lifting a barrel. We applaud Chris and his very professional and educational exhibit. Our thanks to Damien Wall for producing the wood-cut signs for the exhibit.

Digitizing Our Collection

Our resourceful volunteer, Jim Godschalx, who has worked with accessions for the past several years, has taken on the project of photographing our entire collection! He studied commercially built stages but decided he could improve on the design to get just exactly what he wanted, so he built his own portable light box to bring out the best in each artifact.

We have now reached a point where we need to make photographs of our artifacts more accessible and usable to our visitors, both on site and via internet. Currently, we have nearly 80 storage sized boxes, each containing anywhere from 3 to 20 artifacts, some as small as a lapel pin, some as large as a bowling ball! This number keeps growing as more items are donated to us. This is a long-term project, requiring precision, care, and above all, patience. For each artifact, Jim not only photographs the front and sometimes the back also, of the artifact, but notes its name and number on a chart so that we can enter the exact location on our museum software and attach the digital photograph to the artifact record in the software program.



This aids us by giving a visual record for researchers who may be looking for a particular item. Eventually, we hope to enter our artifact collection on our website, so that researchers and casual browsers alike, can see our artifacts and perhaps be enticed to visit our whole collection at one of our museums.

Looking to get involved?


Greeters are needed at several of the museums:

There are some 80—90 volunteer jobs performed for the Historical Society EVERY month, most of them are performed weekly. Many of the greeters at museums have been welcoming people to our exhibits for years. Other volunteers maintain the facilities (including recently upgrading the lawn and flower beds at the Heritage), provide creative support to the educational activities, host fundraising activities, lead walking tours, process archives, create exhibits and the many behind-the-scenes functions that keep us strong and healthy.

Right now there is a great need for walking tour leaders. These volunteers host a small group of visitors from the American Cruise Line ships that come into Liberty Bay. The walks only take about an hour, starting at 9 AM and cover the two-block downtown area. The typical schedule is one walk per week.
