'Ghosts in the Graveyard' Returns to the Poulsbo Cemetery

What can you learn in a cemetery? Join PHS and the Jewel Box Theater on Oct. 29 in the Poulsbo City Cemetery to hear voices from the past tell you of their lives.

This is not a time of haunting, but a wonderful chance to reminisce about history in a quiet and thoughtful way. Meant for all ages, it is a natural time to teach children that a cemetery is a place of history and remembrance, not a fearful, death-filled place.

Costumes are welcome as are pets on a leash and attended at all times (and cleaned up after, as needed).

Allow a good hour to an hour and a half to visit our nine voices, then come to the pavilion in the cemetery for cider, light refreshments, an equestrian history exhibit., and fun craft activities.

Volunteers will direct you to parking within the cemetery in the parking lot or to the lower grassy lot. Please do not park on nearby residential streets.


History Walks in the Door

During the summer, I received an email from a woman in Seattle. She explained that she likes to visit antique and second-hand shops and while in a second-hand shop in Seattle, she ran across a bin of wood-cut and lithograph blocks. Twenty-five cents apiece seemed like a good bargain, so she bought a bunch. When she sorted through them, she noticed some commonalities through a set of about 10 blocks. Fortunately for her, and for us, one block had a book title on it, so she began researching on google. Within a short time, she found the book DJAEVELSKAP written by John Storseth. A little more research on Mr. Storseth led her to contact me.

John Storseth was an active pioneer in the Poulsbo community. He had a lovely home in Vinland across the

street from the Vinland Lutheran Church. He was a logger, a church-school teacher, a farmer, and an active participant in the Farmer's Cooperative Creamery in Poulsbo for at least 15 years. There are many more facets to the life of this scholarly man...author (always in Norwegian), theologian, reporter to the Washington Posten, and the list goes on. He authored DJAEVELSKAP in 1933 and had it edited and apparently illustrated by his friend and wood-cut expert, Ole Sunde whose name appears in the copyright information and whose initials appear on the wood blocks. Happily, we have a copy of Mr. Storseth's book in our library.



Wanting to see our museum, our gracious donor, Debra Stevens, made a special trip to Poulsbo to walk her artifacts into the museum. We spent a delightful time comparing the blocks with illustrations in the book and discovering that some blocks matched pictures of Mr. Storseth's house that we have seen in other publi-

cations. What a treat to receive this gift! Watch for the blocks and book on display soon in the Heritage Museum. If you know how to read Norwegian, or know of a translation of the book, we would love to hear from you. About all we know is that it does have a theological theme...perhaps another Pilgrim's Progress adventure?

Coming Soon to the Heritage Museum

In November we will be installing two new exhibits at the Heritage Museum. Christening Gowns and Baptismal Certificates will take center stage in the Hearts and Home room. We have several lovely christening gowns in our collection and a few ornate baptismal certificates, but not many photos or stories.
